



Modern Māori Quartet


- a suave contemporary Māori show band performing locally! Supported by outstanding Wellington performer, Amba Holly.




Last year we were sad to lose Deborah Burns, a valued member of our Friends of Horowhenua libraries committee.

One of the things that Deborah was concerned about was the way in which current newspapers were stored and made available to the public.



How well do you know your own Library Account?

When you visit the Horowhenua Libraries web page at horowhenua.library.org.nz do you ever check your own account? Do you use the page to check the catalogue, renew your books, place requests to hold items or requests to purchase specific titles?

Yes – you can do all of these things and more.

If you click on the link in the top right corner of your screen you can log in to your account using your library card number and your password. (If you don't have a password – or can't remember it have a chat to the staff at the service desk and they can help you reset it.

Once you log in you will find the list of your current loans where if necessary you can renew individual or all items on issue to you –



On the left of the screen is a menu of options you can choose. You can check to see if you have any outstanding fines, and what they might be for, you can change your personal details or password if necessary, check your reading history – really handy if you can't remember the name of the author of that really good book you just read and would like to find another by the same author.

Purchase suggestions are welcomed by the library staff – they love to hear what you would like to have in the collection and always let you know if it is possible to obtain a copy of the title you want.

You can check to see if there are any messages waiting for you – is that reserved book here yet?

But have you ever looked at your lists?



If you click on **your lists** this is what you will see - a choice between 'your lists' and 'public lists'

If you haven't used this feature there will be no lists in 'Your lists'

To get an idea of how this works click on 'Public lists'.

Here is a small sample of some of the lists available. These lists have been created by library staff and others to help you find books of a particular genre or interest area.

Dip into them for some great reading suggestions if they cover your interest areas.

You can create your own lists using the **New List** button (see above). This is a great place to make a note of any titles held within our library collection that you may want to read in the future.

To add titles to your list all you need to do is find the item you want in the library catalogue and click on the Save to lists button in the item record.
