



Who doesn't like a good story? **Tea and Tales** is a monthly session where you can come along for a cuppa and listen to some stories


—short stories, excerpts from old favourites, introductions to new stories and authors.

Have you met Libby?



For a long time we have been able to access free ebooks from our library using the ebook platform linked to our libraries.

Now we have even more choice as Horowhenua libraries have become subscribers to Libby, a free app which is compatible with IOS and Android devices. Libby even has a font designed to make determining letters easier for dyslexic readers. You can change the font and the background colour to suit your preferences which makes reading on an IPad or similar device much more comfortable. I personally prefer a pale sepia toned background screen which is easy on the eyes.

Just download the FREE app onto your iPad and away you go. You should be able to use your current library password but if you have any problems just have a chat with our lovely library staff. They are happy to help.

When I did a quick check today there were over 13,000 available Fiction titles to choose from! And of course there is a huge non fiction collection too.

And did I say there were also Audio books? Great for listening to on a long road trip, lazing at the beach or even while doing the ironing (if you still do!).

The old library ebook platform still works too—so we have double the fun!

We are so lucky to have such forward thinking library staff.


What we spend our money on.

As you know much of our time is spent raising funds to support out libraries. This money goes towards providing non core items that are not funded in the general library budget.

Over the last few years we have funded:

- The digitization of our local newspapers to Papers Past which helps provide a fascinating look at our local history
- Lap tops for use in the Children's sections of all three libraries to help with storytelling
- Books for babies—a scheme where every new born in the district is given a
 welcome pack from the library encouraging young mothers to read to their
 babies from an early age
- Books for under fives—all newly enrolled pre-schoolers receive a a gift pack which includes a book to keep
- A new custom designed cabinet for newspapers in Te Takere
- Sponsorship of speakers for the Festival of stories
- A new credenza (storage cabinet) for the Historical collection in Te Awahou
- The beautiful orange shelving which now holds the Rental book collection in Te
 Takeretanga o Kura Hau Po
- Piano Tuning
- Various items of furniture for customer comfort in all three libraries
- Funding to assist with additional staff training in areas not covered by HDC funding

We are proud to be able to help and look forward to continuing to do so in the future.
