


You are invited along to Morning Tea

Yes I know it's not Spring yet - but it's not far away!


If you have ever been frustrated by not being able to find the book you want on the shelf when the computer catalogue insists it is there now is your chance to help fix this problem...

FOHL have been asked to contribute funds to help set up the Children's Library section within Te Awahou Nieuwe Stroom which we are more than happy to do.


We will keep you informed as to any contributions we make.
