Review : The Shepherd's Hut by Tim Winton

When Jaxie Clackton finds his brutal father dead under a car, the teen imagines the town will point the finger at him because "People knew I had good reason, it was no secret in Monkton how he was and what he done to us". Jaxie hightails it to the bush and takes us on a journey of near death, salvation and a redemption of sorts.

The catalyst to much of this is the disgraced priest-in-exile he meets at the shepherd's hut of the title. The priest provides a literal salvation of

water, food, clothes and shelter but as the months go by these two provide another type of succour for each other.

These two protagonists are outsiders, not so much lost in the bush as seeking asylum in it, and through them Tim Winton explores many of the BIG themes he has covered in his very fine Western Australian novels since his breakthrough **Cloudstreet** in 1991.

Jaxie struggles with the conflict between masculinity represented by fists and brutality and his desire for a different way to live, for "peace".

The landscape, essentially the third character in the novel, bears silent witness to the human struggles while at the same time is itself degraded and abused with human detritus littering even its remotest parts.

Explorations of belief, goodness, hopelessness and hope, faith and salvation provide a subtle moral clarity to the novel even if you disagree with Jamie's final redemptive act.

And raw, visceral, rich Aussie vernacular places you right in Jaxie's head, heart and soul.

I never expected to be an ebook reader but I love them when I am away on holiday—no need to carry heavy books in my luggage when an e reader or mini ipad will hold dozens of my

favourite titles. With a little help initially it's easy to figure out how to download a title - or several to your device. Our libraries have a collection online which you can use FREE and there is also the added bonus of never having an overdue book as books will automatically return themselves when they are due unless you choose to extend the loan by renewing them.

And now the library will be extending the catalogue of ebooks on offer by linking in with another EBook supplier—Yippee! That's my holiday reading sorted for the foreseeable future.



If you want to explore the ebook catalogue you will find it by clicking on the link at the top of the Library home page... and if you are unsure of how to go on from there don't hesitate to ask one of the librarians to show you how to load a title onto your reader..

You will never run out of reading material while on holiday again as long as you have an internet connection that you can use to download the book you want to read. If you think you are going to be in an internet free zone (and don't we love those!) you can pre-load your device with as many books as you think you may need and read them at your leisure.
