## The AGM for the Friends of Horowhenua libraries will take place on Wednesday 16th March at 11.am. In Te Takere.


Do come along to hear what we have been up to in these Covid times and how we plan to proceed.

#### Just in case you missed this



From 3 December 2021 New Zealand moved to the COVID-19 Protection Framework. The framework introduces a new flexible 3-level approach to managing COVID-19 in the community.

### **Library Services**

Opening Hours in our libraries will be changing.

Monday to Friday hours remain the same but Te Takeretanga O kura Hau Po and Shannon Library will no longer be open during the weekends.

Foxton Library hours Monday to Friday will remain the same and Foxton Library will be open on Saturdays from 10 am - 2.00pm. All libraries will be closed on Sundays.

This is to enable staffing levels to be adequate during opening hours and allow for two teams to function independently to maintain library services in the event of any staff members being affected by Covid which would necessitate self isolation..

- Face masks are mandatory in public areas, use the hand sanitiser provided.
- Follow the one metre physical distancing rule.
- There will only be one entry and exit point to the facility and entry will be limited according to the ability to practice physical distancing.
- There will be security staff on site at entrances to check vaccine passes which will be necessary for you to enter the buildings. You will still need to scan in as well as having to show your vaccine pass.
- Some programmes and resources may not be available.
- Customer details will be recorded for contact tracing.
- Children 14 years and under must be accompanied by an adult.

Please respect these restrictions and support the staff in the implementation of them.
