The Horowhenua Historical Society and the Horowhenua Family history group provide a great service to locals who are researching local history or their family genealogy. The collection of resources available is housed in Te Takeretanga o Kura Hau Po in the Heritage room. Members of these two groups are often on duty in the Heritage room where they are happy to assist anyone who asks.

The societies have requested help with funding some scanning equipment which will enable them to make precious documents and information available in digital format for researchers to use without endangering the delicate originals. Timber, Flax, Flour The History of Mills in The Horowhenua

During the month of August the Library Heritage Room and the Horowhenua Family History Group will display a selection of Milling in the Horowhenua.

Discover the history of Milling in the Horowhenua. The flour mills built from the early 1840's encompass a rich history in the Horowhenua.

Flax mills were a source of employment and created a market in exports which made towns like Foxton the centre of Flax production in New Zealand. Timber mills were vital for helping create early settlements and providing income.
