

Beginning on Thursday May 25th Te Takeretanga o Kura-hau-pō is proud to present 'From Tattoo to Canvas', selected works by local Levin artist Peter Russell.



This exhibition is a survey of Peter's work over the last 4 years, and encompasses his passion for classic cars and hot-rods, as well as his explorations into wildlife and portraits. The title 'From Tattoo to Canvas' refers to how Peter came to start painting, a short 4 years ago. He drew the design for his tattoo, celebrating some of his favourite classic cars, and it was that creative exercise that encouraged him to take the leap and start painting. Since then, he has amassed an impressive body of work, and regularly takes commissions and shows work at car shows. Peter is a self-taught artist who works mainly in acrylic, but can turn his hand to oil also.

'From Tattoo to Canvas' is Peter's first solo exhibition.
